Cold Brew Iced Teas



Spring is upon us! As the sky clears and the weather warms up come have a cool glass of cold brewed tea from Tillerman Tea. Instead of hot brewing then diluting with ice or cooling off in the refrigerator, as most iced teas are prepared, we put whole leaves into a container then fill with room temperature water. This goes into the refrigerator to brew overnight. The resulting cold brewed tea has all the complexity of a hot brewed tea, but is cool and refreshing without any of the bitterness or astringency. A quick shake

and it adds a fizz to the tea, creating a light sparkling refresher!

West Mountain Biluochun



One of China's top ten famous teas, this tea is delicate and floral, a sweet light mouth feel with a long finish. Biluochun is grown on West Dongting Mountain which faces Lake Tai in Jiangsu Province. The name "Biluochun" translate directly as "Green Snail Spring" but this tea has nothing to do with snails! The original name was deemed uncouth by an emperor who loved this tea so he renamed the tea after the hillside, Biluo Hill, the tea grows on. Biluochun can definitely be considered an Imperial tribute tea. Come into

the Oxbow Public Market to taste one of the Emperor's favorite!

From Tea Master Chen Huan Tang we have his Lishan Oolong. Lishan oolong is the most balanced of the Taiwanese oolongs, showcasing the intense floral aromatics and the sweet rich tastes. Hints of jasmine and a buttery mouth feel are characteristic of one of the best in Taiwanese Green Oolong

Alishan Oolong – Chen Huan Tang Winter Harvest



Also from Master Chen we have his Winter Alishan Oolong. If Lishan is the one of the most balanced of the Taiwanese oolongs, than Alishan is one of the most floral. With strong hints of gardenia and jasmine, this oolong has sweet vegetal flavors that blend nicely with the intense floral aromatics. Master Chen decided to oxidize this tea a little higher to bring out a fuller body that balances well with the aromatics.

Last, but certainly not least, we have a small amount of the Winter harvest Roasted Dongding oolong from the Yu Lin Chun Estate from Taiwan. Mr. Marty Wu continues his family's tradition of producing small lots of this full-bodied oolong from his private estate in Nantou County, central Taiwan. Roasted to bring out the toasted nuttiness, this tea still has hints of floral aromatics and a finish reminiscent of dried apricots. Wonderfully complex, and full bodied, this Roasted Dongding truly showcases the skill of the tea maker!
